Tirthan Valley Surrounded by the Great Himalayan National Park (GHNP), this beautiful valley

situated beside the Tirthan River is one of the hidden tourist places in Himachal. Tirthan Valley is an excellent place to relax in the lap of mother nature. The best time to visit Tirthan Valley will be the Spring season and early summers.



Pabbar is one of the most enchanting places in Himachal Pradesh, isolated

Pradesh. The lake has a depth unknown to anyone so far. Go in July-August for the green colors and the flowers or in January-March when it is enveloped


